## What makes local farmland so important?

#### **Educational benefits**

■ Retain knowledge of local farming practices that future generations may learn from & use.

#### **Economic benefits**

Support local business by purchasing locally grown goods.

A more sustainable alternative to large-scale industrial agriculture.

### Part of our heritage

- Farming has been a part of Eliot since it was settled.
- Several families in Eliot have maintained working farms for multiple generations.
