What makes the York Pond area so important?

Rare & endangered species habitat

- Chestnut Oak
- Flowering Dogwood

- Blanding's Turtle
- Ringed Boghaunter Dragonfly

Unfragmented forests

■ It has been said that the Mt. Agamenticus region is the largest relatively undeveloped coastal area between Portland ME & Washington DC.

Clean water for all

• The 108 acres of shoreline owned by Eliot provides an essential wetland buffer that protects water quality.


Archaeological & cultural sites

• Rich in the history of the Punkintown settlements dating back to the 1700s.

Public access

■ Through recreational trails & water access sites.

"Environmentally, we live at the upper limits of the southern forests and at the lower limits of the northern forests so we have species of both. The same is true for the flora and fauna, or wildlife, giving a larger diversity of plants, animals, reptiles, turtles, etc., than is usual."
