Great Heath

*Between Rte. 236, State Rd., Depot Rd.,
and Bradstreet Ln.*

What makes the Great Heath so important?

Significant wildlife habitat

- *Known to harbor wading bird rookeries*

Rare & endangered species habitat

- *New England Cottontail*
- *Spotted Turtle*
- *Blanding's Turtle*
- *Juniper Hairstreak*
- *Swamp White Oak*
- *Pendulus Bulrush*
- *Atlantic White Cedar*

Ecological value

- *Large unfragmented wetland*
- *Close to streams*
- *Floodplains*
- *Occupies a headwater tributary basin of Great Creek*

Health benefits

- *Provides an essential buffer that protects water quality.*

"Environmentally, we live at the upper limits of the southern forests and at the lower limits of the northern forests so we have species of both. The same is true for the flora and fauna, or wildlife, giving a larger diversity of plants, animals, reptiles, turtles, etc., than is usual."
