# **Public input:**

The Conservation Commission would like to look further into the project and the information available to see what use it could 41 serve the Commission and who would be the point of contact for the project for any 42 questions or concerns that may arise. #### Libbey Farm- Anna Boudreau request:

Anna Boudreau is a professional grant writer who has been hired by the Gorranson's 47 (the owners of Libbey Farm). She is asking the Conservation Commission, on behalf of 48 the Gorranson's, for a currently undetermined amount of money to help recoup some of 49 the money that was invested into the purchase of the Libbey Farm property. The 50 requested amount will be considered matching funds as Ms. Boudreau moves forward 51 52 with a grant request from the federal Natural Resources Conservation Service. Ms. Boudreau is also requesting a letter from the Commission stating its support of the 53 project and willingness to partially fund it, provided that the proposed spending passes a 54 vote by the Town in June of 2017. Kim offered to draft a letter and send it to Anna 55 56

Boudreau as soon as possible. All Commission members voted in favor of sending the

57 letter.
